Amman Imman empowers and helps preserve Africa's most vulnerable indigenous peoples and engages students worldwide as socially conscious leaders. Through our Africa-based program, **Oases of Life**, we establish points of civilization that flourish, beginning with the construction of permanent water sources. Our programs emphasize the role of women and youth as a guiding force for societal stability, optimism, and resilience.

Amman Imman's Work and Accomplishments:

- Through our program, *Oases of Life*, we serve nomadic populations of the Azawak, an arid Florida-sized valley on the edge of the Sahara Desert in Niger, among the poorest nations of the world.
- We work in the Sahel, one of the areas on Earth worst-hit by climate change. We offer sustainable solutions for populations to adapt to their rapidly changing environment.
- Through our program, *Wells of Love*, we serve as the link between students of the global north and the global south, as they reach out to one another in solidarity to build ties of peace and friendship.
- Thousands of students in more than a hundred schools worldwide partner with Amman Imman to become advocates for the children of our African communities.
- *Amman Imman* was recently honored as one of the Top 500 NGOs in the world (#185). In the same rankings we were in the top 10 water-focused NGOs.
- We offer a hand of friendship from the Western world to Muslim populations in danger of falling under the influence of extremists.
- We bring stability to areas at risk of conflict, brought on by poverty and regional political instability.
- Our boreholes provide permanent sources of sustainable and clean water to more than 100,000 Tuareg and Fulani pastoralists who in the past endured perpetual thirst.
- Our cereal and fodder banks, livestock programs, and organic gardens offer food security to over 10,000 children and adults, as well as their animals.
- Our mobile health clinic, malaria prevention program, and sanitation outreach help make health services accessible for more than 15,000 people.
- Our classrooms and educational programs encourage hundreds of girls to stay in school.
- Our women's livestock projects and artisan cooperatives offer additional economic security for several hundred women. Management and literacy training helps them gain autonomy.
- 90% of our staff (employees and volunteers) are women, both in America and in Africa.
- Vision and goals: Help preserve a vanishing world heritage, promote stability and opportunity, empower women, save children, foster future change makers, and serve at least 500,000 people within the next five years.
